

u:search

The Library Search Engine

What is u:search?

<u>u:search</u> is the central search engine of Vienna University Library, with which you can search and find most of the available media.

You can also use u:search to:

- order or reserve items
- access e-resources (e-books, e-journals, databases, etc.)
- view your library account
- save search results to your bookmarks



u:search in a nutshell

What can you find with u:search?


- Books and other media such as journals, university publications, audiovisual media and, in some cases, articles,
- print collections and e-resources,
- media from all library locations of the University of Vienna (main library, the special libraries and the University Archives)
- an overview of all databases available at Vienna University Library.

What can't you find with u:search?

- Unfortunately, older literature is not always fully catalogued online
- Even older volumes of journals, newspapers or series are not always fully indexed
- u:search will not, of course, find any items that are not held by the University Library.



Sign in (1)




You can log in with your u:account under "Sign in". Sign in button and drop-down menu in the top right corner of u:search.

- Students and staff of the University of Vienna are automatically logged in to u:access
- u:access allows members of the university to access licensed e-resources from outside the university.

Sign in (2)



After logging in, you will find several options in the drop-down menu at the top right corner next to your name.

You can go to

- My Account
- My Loans My Requests
- Saved records.
- You can also change the language of the search interface to English/German.



Five Tips for u:search

1. Sign in

Log in to your u:account at the start of your research. This will allow you to view loan information, request or reserve books and access e-resources via u:access.

2. Advanced Search

For a change of pace, try using the Advanced Search feature for your search. This allows you to enter more complex searches and get more precise results.

3. Filter

Reduce (too) long result lists by using one or more filters. For example, if you are looking for recent articles from scientific journals, you can select the three filters Peerreviewed journals, Article and Creation date.

4. Detail view

Click on the hits in the results list to view the detail view. Reading the 'small print' about a work will help you to decide whether or not it is relevant to you. You will also find the button to request/reserve a book or the link to the full-text in the detail view.

5. Saved records

As you search, save interesting hits to your saved records by clicking the pin icon to quickly find these search results again later. You can also add custom labels to your saved records to help you organise your searches, such as subject headings or todo items like "Study chapter 3".



Borrowing, renewing, ordering



- Most loanable items can be borrowed for up to 12 months – if nobody else places a hold (Exception: weekend, overnight)
- Guaranteed period: 14 days
- Automatic renewal for 14-days for a maximum period of up to 12 months—if nobody else places a hold (Exception: weekend, overnight)



Placing a hold on items



- You can place a hold to be next in line for an item on loan
- Find item on library shelf OR pre-order item and collect it from a library counter: information via u:search, the library search engine, after you have signed in



u:access: Accessing E-Resources



<u>u:access - Vienna University Library</u>

- u:access allows you access to VUL eresources by logging in via your u:account
- Sign in to u:search = sign in u:access
- Check whether u:access forms part of the URL of a resource
- To activate u:access if you have already connected to a licensed resource, we recommend installing the u:access bookmark.









Other Research Tools & Library Cataolgues

E-journals, Databases, Inter-library Loan

E-journals

E-journals are also listed in the <u>Electronic Journals Library (EZB)</u> *Z*. The EZB is a reference tool for scholarly e-journals and uses traffic light colours to indicate access to full-text.

- Green journals are open access.
- Yellow journals are licensed by the Vienna University Library and accessible via <u>u:access</u>.
- Red journals are not licensed and therefore full-text access is not possible. However, it is often possible to view tables of contents and abstracts.
- For journals with the EUR symbol €, individual articles can be used for a fee.



Databases

Databases contain comprehensive bibliographic information and allow, among other things, searches for dependent publications such as articles in journals and anthologies.

- Each subject area has its own databases.
- Databases often differ in terms of the period covered, the journals analysed, the search options, the thesauri used, and so on.

Academic theses and consortium catalogue

Academic theses of the University of Vienna can also be searched for in <u>u:theses</u>.

- u:theses is a repository of theses that have been positively evaluated at the University of Vienna since 2008.
- If the authors agree, the theses can also be offered for download in digital form.

Media from many other Austrian libraries can be searched using the <u>Austrian Library</u> Network Search Engine ⊅.

- The consortium catalogue is an Austria-wide media search engine. It searches the holdings of the Austrian Library Network's members, such as the Austrian National Library, university libraries, libraries of Fachhochschulen and many more.
- You can request any hits you find via the inter-library loan service for a fee.



Karlsruhe Virtual Catalog

Via the KVK - Karlsruher Virtueller Katalog (Karlsruhe Virtual Catalog) ↗

- you can search for **media from international libraries** and order them via inter-library loan.
- The KVK does not contain any records of its own, but forwards your search query to all selected library catalogues, lists of open access media, bookshops and antiquarian bookshops.

Historic Literature

Unfortunately, **historic literature** from the University Library is not always fully catalogued online in u:search.

For these holdings, scanned <u>historical catalogues</u> are available, such as the <u>main library's</u> author index until 1931 (in German).

The old handwritten volume catalogue has been scanned and made available through the KatZoom catalogue. To use the catalogue, please refer to the <u>search help (in German)</u> and <u>rules and regulartory criteria (in German)</u>. You can order works you have found using the <u>online request form for requesting uncatalogued items</u>.



If source not available from Vienna University Library

 - Order loans of books/copies of articles via form in u:search
 - ILL will continue undisturbed by renovation work


