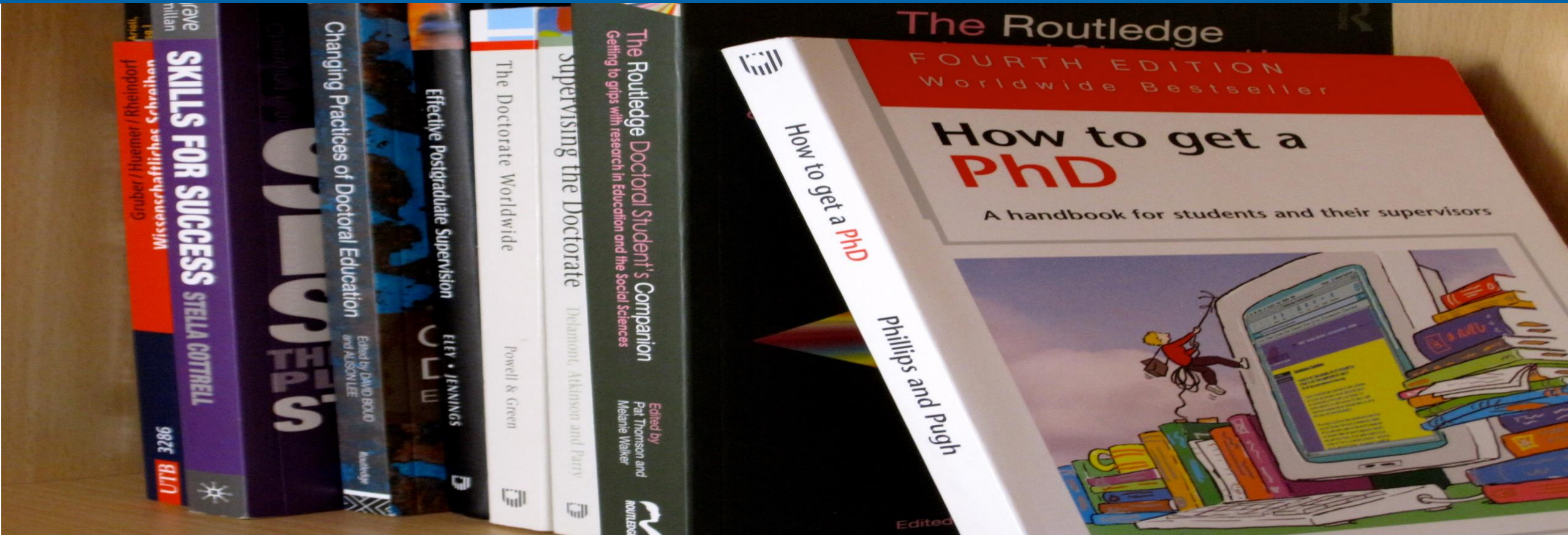

The University of Vienna

- One of the oldest and largest universities in Central Europe
- 15 Faculties & 4 Reserach Centers spread over more than 60 locations
- PhD studies in a wide range of fields (Humanities, Social-, Natural- and Life Sciences, Law, Economics,)
- Approx. 5000 PhD Candidates enrolled
- About 40% are international PhD Candidates

Early stage researchers are expected to

- make an original contribution to the field
- present research findings at conferences, etc.
- engage in scientific activities
- increase your research and transferable skills

Recommendation: Increase your PhD awarness

- Learn how the system works
- Get familiar with the common practices at your faculty
- Make sure you know what a PhD actually is

Structure of the Doctorate at the University of Vienna



Entry Phase

- Specification of the research topic & planning of research project
- Writing your research proposal
- Submission & presentation of research proposal at the faculty within the first year

Recommendation: Attend public presentations to get an idea how it is organized at your faculty

The research proposal | Exposé

- **Format**
 - Approx. 10 pages
- **Content**
 - Description of the topic including clear research questions
 - Outline of the state of the art
 - Illustration of chosen methods
 - Relevant literature
 - Time & work plan

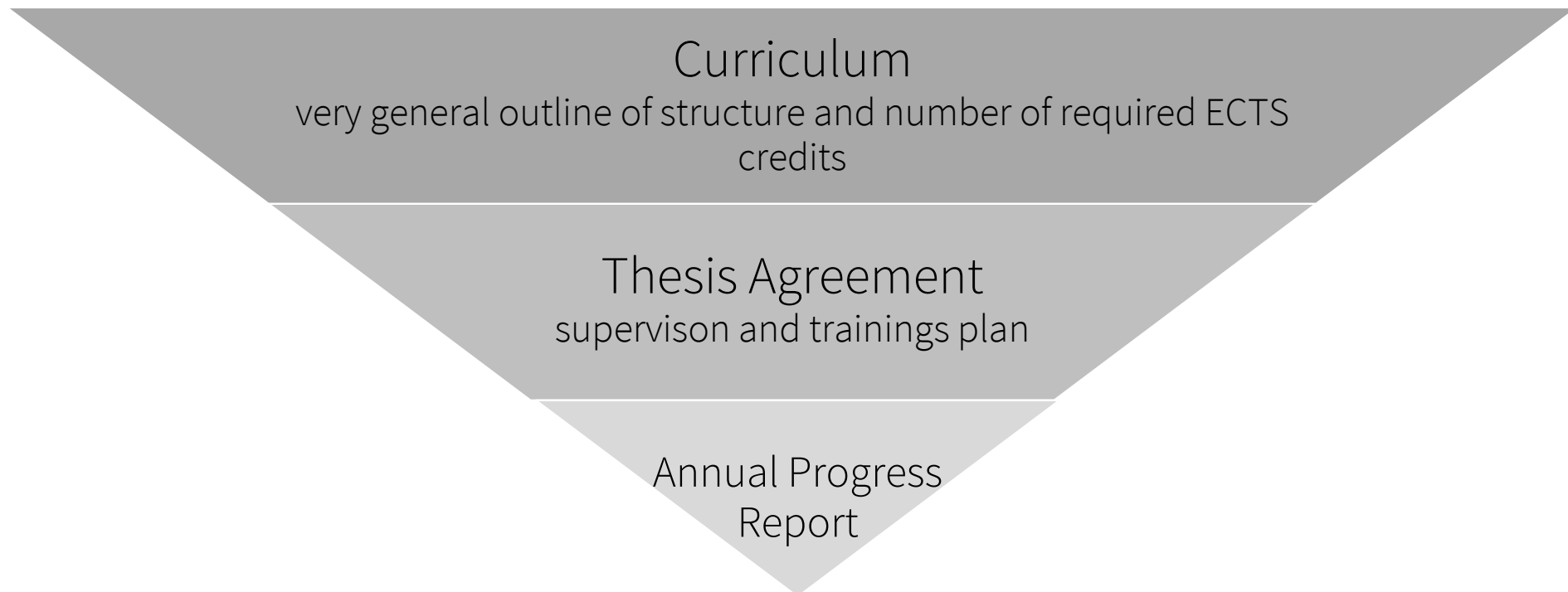
Recommendation: Write, write, write

- Start writing as early as possible,
- Writing skills can be trained: Many workshops on academic writing are available
- Join a thesis writing group! They are useful instruments to escape isolation
- Check the offers of your school: Many Doctoral Schools provide specific pre-FÖP trainings

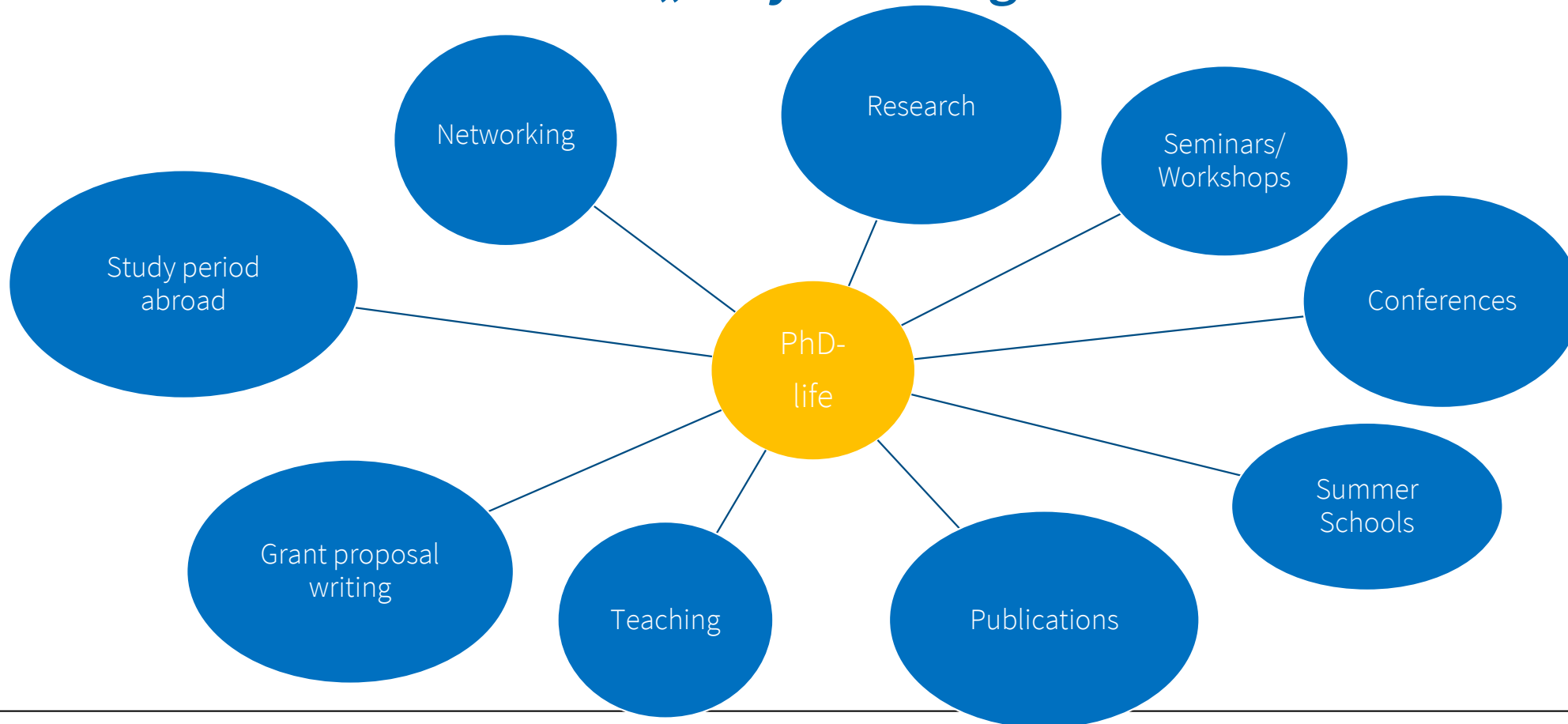
Public presentation of research proposal

- Mandatory within the first year
- Quality assurance & feedback from the Doctoral Advisory Board
- Exchange with peers
- Positive presentation is precondition for the approval of your topic
- Organisation:
 - 2-3 dates per Semester
 - Registration at the StudyServiceCenter

PhD life includes more than „only“ writing a thesis



Recommendation: Make the most of opportunities which arise

- Attend workshops, conferences, seminars
- Take part in training seminars
- Get involved in the activities at your department/of your doctoral school
- If possible, include a research stay abroad
- Build up your future networks,



ResearchComp: a tool that ...

- helps you to identify and strengthen essential research and transferable skills from early on
- helps you to evaluate your current competencies and set specific goals
- encourages a systematic way of acquiring necessary skills for your career development

Recommendation: Planning is essential

- Master your time management – effective time management is essential
- Set clear milestones
- Use the annual progress report as planning tool
- Start thinking about your life after your PhD early
- Identify skills and experiences needed for your desired career path

2. Responsibilities of supervisors

Every doctoral candidate has one main supervisor and access to at least one other member of the school (including advanced post docs) who provide complementary advice and feedback. Each school defines the role and range of activities for additional supervisors. Main supervisors are research-active members of the school and are assigned to the candidate (in agreement with the supervisor) by the director.

The main supervisor:

- a) promotes the scientific development of the doctoral researcher;
- b) commits to supervising the doctoral candidate for regular comments on the candidate's progress and
- c) clarifies the expectations for supervision using the candidate and all supervisors sign the indication of a doctoral thesis agreement, which is amended during the supervision;
- d) supports the doctoral candidate to prepare the thesis;
- e) clarifies ownership of the data generated during the supervision;
- f) ensures together with the director of the school the candidate's own research, personal and professional development;
- g) ensures together with the director of the school the necessary infrastructure;
- h) stays updated about the latest progress;
- i) encourages that the results are presented in a timely manner;
- j) verifies that the final thesis complies with the requirements;
- k) helps to enforce compliance with the requirements;
- l) helps the candidate to apply for funding;
- m) assists the doctoral candidate in the preparation of the thesis;
- n) contributes to the reputation of the school;
- o) supports the doctoral candidate in the preparation of the thesis;
- p) provides the necessary support for the candidate.



3. Responsibilities of the doctoral candidate

Admission ("Zulassung") as a Doctoral student to the University of Vienna and admission ("Aufnahme") to the school are prerequisites to be a member of the school. The school can define particular offers and services (e.g. travel grants) that are restricted to its members and other offers and services that are open to all admitted ("zugelassen") doctoral candidates of the field. Membership in the school can be made dependent on fulfillment of particular obligations (e.g. participation in seminars, presentation of preliminary results etc.).

The doctoral candidate:

- a) clarifies the expectations for supervision and agrees upon the practical aspects of supervision using the available forms (Doctoral thesis agreement and annual progress reports);
- b) fulfills the requirements of the doctoral school, the curriculum and the doctoral thesis agreement agreed upon at the time of admission, especially the public presentation at the end of the first study year (FOP);
- c) is responsible for setting up a TAC (Thesis Advisory Committee) in close consultation with the supervisor;
- d) organizes and prepares adequately for the yearly TAC meeting (in the line with the TAC requirements);
- e) presents their progress at least once a year to the faculty of the school (for instance in the yearly TAC meeting);
- f) takes the supervisor(s) guidance and feedback into due consideration;
- g) participates actively in courses, workshops, symposia and other respective events which promote integration into the scientific community;
- h) is committed to the doctoral project and understands that the research work and completion of the doctoral degree studies are ultimately their own responsibility;
- i) ensures that the thesis is their own work and that the final version has been read and commented upon by the supervisor(s) prior to submission for examination;
- j) adopts and understands the protocol of good scientific practice, the general principles of ethical aspects in science and the ethical regulations of the research field;
- k) becomes familiar with the relevant high-quality outlets (journals, proceedings, series, etc.) suitable for publishing the results;
- l) includes the University of Vienna as an affiliation on publications resulting from the doctoral project;
- m) alerts the supervisor and the director of the doctoral school of any difficulties or delays at an early stage and address these issues honestly in the annual progress reports;
- n) provides a regular (at least annual) progress report.



Code of Good Practice for Doctoral Schools (October 2023)

This document provides guidelines for good practice that are binding for all doctoral schools at the University of Vienna. Schools can propose additional responsibilities (in an "Addendum") that go beyond the listed below.

Responsibilities of the director of doctoral school

The director of a doctoral school is an internationally renowned scholar. The director is appointed by the University of Vienna for a period of 2 years, the Deans of the involved Faculties provide statements of support for a teaching reduction.

Tasks:

- 1. The director (in consultation with the advisory board) proposes the leadership team and other elements of the school and proposes the leadership team and other elements of the school in the usual way) and must oversee the school's activities.

Doctoral Candidate

- Your dissertation must be your contribution to the scientific community

- **Supervisor(s)**
 - Experts in your field
 - Give guidance, continuous support & feedback
- **Thesis Advisory Committee (TAC)**
 - 2-3 mentors chosen by the PhD candidate
 - Meets once a year to give feedback on the PhD project and your personal development
- **Directors of the Doctoral Study Programmes**
 - Responsible for quality assurance
 - Acceptance of achievements, Chair FÖP and Defence,...
