







ORCID offers a solution to name ambiguity


ORCID

- **ORCID**[®] (Open Researcher & Contributor ID) is an international, interdisciplinary, open and non-profit organization. Its main goal is to provide a unique identification for researchers.
- The **ORCID iD** is a nonproprietary 16-digit code to uniquely identify scientific and other academic authors and contributors. It aims to classify authorship and facilitate name disambiguation.






Your ORCID iD is your persistent identifier



ORCID has become a standard for most research institutions, publishers, research tools and libraries across the world.












How to set up an ORCID record (via u:cris)
